K.B.SINHA - K.B TO HIS COLLEAGUES AND KRI TO FAMILY AND FRIENDS

My Father Krishna Behari Sinha was fondly referred to as Kri (short for Krishna) by family and friends. Post his departure for his heavenly abode, I have been told stories about him of which I would like to share two instances.

The first concerned my cousin who had been selected to join Tata Steel in the campus interview way back in 1970. According to him, at that time he weighed only 45 kgs then (imagine!) and "Kri Papa" was apprehensive that he would be rejected for being under-weight. However, on the given day, Sabita Amma fed him with a dozen bananas and made him drink gallons and gallons of water, hoping to add some kilos, before sending him off for his medical. To his horror, the Medical Officer took one look at him and guessed as much and asked "kitne kele khaye ho?" Amma had an amused smile and when Kri Papa returned from office, he too had a similar smile! They didn't say anything except that he should not lose heart. When he went to collect the report the next day, with his heart in his mouth, the MO gave him a 'pass' report with a smile. He then realized that Kri Papa must have put in a word to the MO, but of course he never admitted to having had done any such thing.

The second is a narration from my uncle's great grand daughter concerning "Kri Baba's" car. He had left it in the village so that he could use it whenever he went there. However, the grand children had other ideas during their winter vacation at the village. They wanted to learn driving! So under the guidance of their elder cousins they took out this car to the Club house maidan opposite the House and drove it in circles till the fuel ran out. In her words, "we simply pushed the car back home and back under the cover". We were so pleased (and more than a bit scared of being caught out!) with our escapade ..and that no one was the wiser!

Only years later, during a trip to Jamshedpur in 2009, did "Kri Nana" smile and casually mention that he had known all along what they had done and that he would have taught them driving "legally" if they had asked him. Everyone had a good laugh that night.

My Father was a caring man and perhaps what was closest to his heart was Rajendra Vidyalaya, a school he had helped establish and one which is a pride of Jamshedpur today. Wherever he is, he will always wish for the very best for all students and faculty members of R.V.


On the other hand although his team was defeated but this defeat did not deter their courage and determination and they won the match against Karnataka for the third place. They were declared the third runner up.




